

Managers Report November – December 2022

WOODLANDS

Forest operations are complete for the year. The last loads were hauled out of Lost Ledge last week and the Branch 7 road extension was also finished.

Until the end of November around 22,150m3 were shipped with a few more loads in December from Lost Ledge. Below shows the breakdown by CP and species. Similar to last year hemlock was top of the list for species harvested. The ROW timber was all from clearing the right of way on the Lost Ledge road, which produced 640m3 to help pay for the upgrades.

Timber development will happen up Lost Ledge over the winter and will focus on laying out a road system towards the edge of the bench above Lardeau, along with potential fuel reduction projects and blocks for straight timber harvesting.
